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






iowa assessments

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Summit Schools is committed to preparing our students to work in an evolving, information-centered global community of the 21st century.

Summit's tutoring program is open to all children in the Cedar Rapids metro area. Each student has an individualized tutoring plan where the student sets his/her goals, schedule and setting (individual or group tutoring). Summit features tutors who are trained in the Orton-Gillingham reading method. Currently, Summit offers tutoring in reading, Orton-Gillingham, spelling, writing, basic math, algebra, geometry, homework help, study skills, music, and Spanish.

Tutoring schedules are separated into two programs: academic year, which runs from September-May, and summer, which run eight weeks throughout June and July.
