- Valid Iowa teaching license with appropriate endorsements, specifically a reading endorsement and training in Orton-Gillingham and/or willingness to be trained
- Successful student teaching and/or prior teaching experience
- Completion of Child Abuse and Dependent Adult Abuse Mandatory Reporter training, and all other training(s) as required by state law
