A Note from our Head of Schools

Summit Schools was founded in 1998 by a small group of parents who were passionate about education. Summit and its predecessors - Linn Academy and McLeod Academy - have a long

history in education. The school has undergone changes in location and management, but its aim to provide an environment rich with real-life experiences and personalized learning has remained constant. Twenty five years later, thousands of local students have benefited from Summit attending the independent school, participating in popular summer camps, or seeking services from the tutoring program.

Summit celebrated its 25th year with a back-to-school ice cream social with families, a gala event and online fundraiser, and all-school community service projects. Summit's 25th anniversary theme throughout the school year was "Celebrating our silver anniversary with golden opportunities." Twenty five years later, Summit is stronger than ever as you will see here in this Community Report, and we couldn't have done it without the continued financial support from Summit families, alumni, staff, board and friends.



learning at Summit

Summit's autonomy and small class sizes make it easier to tailor instruction to help students. Summit employs well-respected and retired Summit teachers to work with students in need of more intensive remediation in math and literacy.

Summit is the only school in the area that exclusively teaches Orton-Gillingham (O-G), the phonics-based sensory reading method, which has been especially effective in children with learning disabilities and differences. Summit's classroom teachers are all trained in O-G and its benefits. Summit's ongoing O-G training in the fall of 2023 was made possible in part with funds raised in the 2023 Fun Run, so thank you to the families and students who made this important and generous investment in Summit's teaching staff!


